God finds them in their shame and sadness about what they had done while he is walking in the garden and has a big talk with them.

Read Genesis 3: 14-24. This passage tells us about the consequences of their sin in the garden. **But he doesn't leave us hopeless!** God tells them that Satan may have tried to harm them forever but Jesus will get the ultimate victory (vs. 15)

Read vs. 21. It tells us that God kills an animal to make clothing for Adam and Eve. God shows his love for us by killing something he delighted in to cover their mistakes. Can you think of another time this happens in the Bible? (Hint: Matthew 27)

## DAY 4



Let's fast forward some...  and  have lots of .

But the more people that existed on the earth, the more bad choices people made. Slowly read through Genesis 6: 11-9:17 and answer the questions. It may be helpful to draw the parts of the story on another piece of paper.

- What did God not like about the earth in verse 11?
- God was so angry with people. Did he have a right to be angry?
- What did God say he was going to do because mankind was so sinful?
- But God wanted to spare Noah and his family! Why?

**So...God told Noah to build a really BIG boat.**

- What was Noah told to put on the boat?
- How long did they stay on the boat?
- What did God send to tell them he would never flood the earth again?

Noah did something amazing when he got off the boat. Read Genesis 8:20. He built an altar and **WORSHIPPED!** Noah's first response to God providing dry land is to worship. List somethings below that you can worship and praise God for today.

## DAY 5



Our last stop through the first era is in Genesis 11. But first lets backtrack just a little bit. Noah and his family get off the boat and did just like Adam and Eve- they have lots of babies and repopulate the earth. They were told to go all over but instead, the people all stayed together.

Turn to Genesis 11 and read verses 1-4.

- What did the people have in common? They all spoke \_\_\_\_\_.
- With their common language they decided they wanted to make lots of \_\_\_\_\_. (verse 3)
- Then once they made bricks, the people wanted to build a \_\_\_\_\_ and a \_\_\_\_\_ that went all the way to heaven. (vs. 4.)
