Read 1 Samuel 17:31-37. What does David say has prepared him for this moment? Its important for us to know that God uses every little detail in our lives to prepare us for the next thing. We may not understand how the simple acts of our day to day lives can be meaningful, but when put in God's hands, the little things can be used to do big things.

Read 1 Samuel 17:47. Who does David say will actually fight this fight? David faithfully brought his ability to use a slingshot to the war. But he knew that without God, he wasn't able to complete this feet. He said to his people and the Philistines that the battle is the Lord's.

Remember that today as you lay your head down. When we are up against a giant situation in our lives, if we bring what we know and we trust in the Lord, he will fight for us.

Read 1 Kings 3: 6-9. What did Solomon ask for? Does that surprise you?

God makes good on this promise and makes Solomon the wisest man. He uses his wisdom to make a lot of hard choices in his kingdom. One of the wisest things he did was build the temple that his dad wanted to build.

Why do you think it was important for Solomon to build a temple?

If you have the chance, read 1 Kings 6:14-36. Go slow and discuss how elaborate and beautiful this temple was! It was truly a temple built for a king!

The same place Abraham worshipped the Lord after the ram took the place of Issac, is the place Solomon (years and years later) build the temple. God loves the details about the building place.
